HOW TO BECOME A MEMBER OF CLUB 8848

Cost

- Price for one individual is CHF 10. Includes the challenger kit, an energy bar and membership for one year.
- Ski schools/ski clubs with a group of 6 people or more pay a flat rate of CHF 50 per group (CHF 100 for groups of 15 or more). Includes the challenger kit, an energy bar and member-ship for one year.

Procedure

- After registering, you will go to the Lagalb mountain station, where the check-in desk is located. At the check-in desk, you can purchase your challenger kit for CHF 10 (CHF 50 for ski schools and ski clubs with groups of 6 people or more, CHF 100 for groups of 15 or more). The kit includes a tracking card, a retractable card holder that you can attach to the zip on your jacket, a wristband and an energy bar.
- Your personal **participant ID**, **the date** and **your signature** are recorded on the tracking card (after that, you can decide if you want to tackle Piz Lagalb first, or if you want to start with the steepest prepared slope in Graubünden).
- On the summit and at the valley station, there are card punches that allow you to record your current lap status. As soon as you complete all your laps, you just pop your documents into the check-out box at the Lagalb valley station and you will later receive your certificate by post.
- To make sure you have plenty of energy for the challenge, when you buy the challenger kit, you will receive a home-made energy bar from the Albris bakery.



Becoming a member of Club 8848 is subject to the following conditions:

- Complete the Lagalb run 11 times on skis, a snowboard, Telemark skis or freeride skis
- Hike up Piz Lagalb four times on foot from the mountain station to Piz Lagalb
- All to be completed in one day!
- You can do the challenge on any day during the winter season and you can also attempt it multiple times.

- You can purchase the challenger kit at the mountain station for CHF 10. When you register, your personal participant ID will be recorded on your stamp card.
- Punch your card at the pyramid every time you reach the summit, and have the staff at the Lagalb valley station punch your card each time you come back down.
- Do not leave the marked out route to the summit (marked with red marker posts connected with rope)
- The 10 FIS rules also apply to participants in this challenge. Be aware of other skiers at all times.
- You ascend and descend at your own risk and under your own responsibility.
- Always ask the cable car staff about the current status of the route for ascending to the summit
- Clothing: wear clothing that is appropriate for the weather.
- You must follow the instructions of the SOS slope and rescue service.
