

## The ideal ski touring route for training

## Information and rules

## SOS Diavolezza Lagalb: Phone +41 81 839 39 03

- The Diavolezza Challenge is an ascending route specifically for touring skis and splitboards. It is signposted with yellow marker posts and protected from the dangers of the mountains, but it is not groomed or patrolled. **No final slope patrol takes place at the end of the day!**
- Heed all warning signs and closure signs.
- Do not leave the signposted route (marked with yellow marker posts).
- The 10 FIS rules also apply to ski tourers.
- You ascend and descend at your own risk and under your own responsibility.
- It is forbidden to descend on the ascent route.
- No snowshoeing.
- Check the information board at the entrance to the valley station to find out about the current status of the Diavolezza Challenge ascent route, the slopes and the cable cars.
- The Diavolezza Challenge ski touring route is only open when the cable cars are operating.

- Outside of the operating hours of the cable cars, the Diavolezza Challenge ski touring route and the downhill run on the slope are closed and not protected against dangers such as artificially triggered avalanches and snow groomers with winches and cutters. **Danger to life!**
- Pay attention to closures due to danger of avalanche or due to artificial triggering of avalanches.
- Check the current avalanche situation at www.slf.ch or at the ticket office at the Diavolezza valley station.
- Safety equipment: Avalanche transceiver, avalanche shovel and avalanche probe. Wearing a helmet is recommended.
- Clothing: wear clothing that is appropriate for the weather.
- Eating and drinking: Take plenty of breaks and drink enough fluids (no alcoholic drinks). Having a small snack during the ascent is recommended.
- You must follow the instructions of the SOS slope and rescue service.
- Valid ticket: you can only use the Diavolezza Challenge ski touring route with a valid ticket.
- Pass through the turnstile with your ticket.
- Do not leave any litter or waste behind on the route.

## Night training sessions: additional information and rules

- On Fridays from 7.00 p.m. to 9.00 p.m.
- You must wear a headlamp.
- Do not go up or down alone. Stay in groups of at least two at all times when on the route.
- Please take note of the Diavolezza Challenge information and rules.
- Head back to the valley station by 9.00 p.m. at the latest. From 9 p.m. onwards, snow groomers with winches and cutters will be in operation these can be a danger to life!
- The Diavolezza Lagalb AG SOS slope and rescue service does not operate during the night training sessions.
