Night-time ski touring training on the Diavolezza slope

Information and rules

Emergency Number, Swiss Alpine Rescue/Swiss Air Rescue (Rega): 1414

Please also note page 3

- On Fridays from 7.00 p.m. to 9.00 p.m.
- You must wear a headlamp.
- Do not go up or down alone. Stay in groups of at least two at all times when on the route.
- Head back to the valley station by 9.00 p.m. at the latest. From 9 p.m. onwards, snow groomers with winches and cutters will be in operation – these can be a **danger to life!**
- The Diavolezza Lagalb AG SOS slope and rescue service **does not operate** during the night training sessions.
- Heed all warning signs and closure signs (e.g. risk of avalanche, avalanche blasting).
- Do not leave marked slope 2a or 2b.
- You must follow the instructions issued by the Diavolezza/Lagalb cable car staff.
- The 10 FIS rules also apply to ski tourers.
- You ascend and descend at your own risk and under your own responsibility.
- No snowshoeing.

FAIRY-TALE MOUNTAIN SCENERY



- Check the information board at the entrance to the valley station to find out about the current status of night training slope No. 2a/2b.
- Outside of the night training period, slope 2a/2b is closed and not protected against dangers such as avalanche blasting or snow groomers with winches and cutters. **These can pose a danger to life!**
- Check the current avalanche situation at www.slf.ch.
- Safety equipment: Avalanche transceiver, avalanche shovel and avalanche probe. Wearing a helmet is recommended.
- Clothing: wear clothing that is appropriate for the weather.
- Eating and drinking: Take plenty of breaks and drink enough fluids (no alcoholic drinks). Having a small snack during the ascent is recommended.
- Do not leave any litter or waste behind on the route.



Touring on pistes

Ascents and descents are at your own risk.

RULE 1

No ascending or descending outside transport facility operating hours.

WARNING DANGER TO LIFE!

Piste grooming machines prepare the slopes after closing time and during the night. They move on barely visible steel cables that are several hundred metres long.

Avalanches are artificially triggered to secure the pistes, including at night.



RULE 2

Outside the operating hours of the transport facilities, only use pistes that are explicitly open for ski touring.

RULE 3

Snow sports operations take priority.

Pay attention to descending piste users.

The FIS rules apply to ski tourers too.

During operating hours, only ascend at the piste edge and in single file.



RULE 4

Follow the instructions of the piste patrol and rescue services.



RULE 6

Respect wildlife reserves and conservation areas.

Avoid the forest at dusk and at night.



RULE 5

Observe bans on touring on pistes.
